#### **Education and Outreach**

#### **Year One**

- Inform neighborhood and incoming residents and visitors of the Firewise program and provide materials.
- Develop a Firewise Facebook page/group page or website and dedicated email address. Request that all neighbors sign up for Tahoe RCD newsletter.
- Develop volunteer hours tracking allowing both digital and standard reporting of hours.
- Obtain fire related printed materials from Tahoe RCD and distribute wildfire
  preparedness materials, including topics such as defensible space, home hardening,
  and evacuation planning to educate the community.
- Develop Firewise community member email and mailing lists and implement mail-outs with educational materials about the threats of community wildfires and ways to reduce the risk.
- Promote Firewise community awareness and participation through social media, fliers/handouts, and posters in partnership with Tahoe RCD.
- Host a Firewise community wildfire preparedness event with educational presentations that communicate defensible space, home hardening, and/or evacuation planning materials.
   Provide additional educational webinars from Living with Fire (University of Reno) and Tahoe RCD.

#### **Year Two**

- Share Action Plan for Year Two.
- Host community wildfire preparedness event.
- Host Firewise community meetings.
- Conduct home hazard assessments.
- Celebrate individual homeowner successes though posting on the Firewise social media to maintain heightened awareness and to encourage others to act.
- Update Firewise community members on Action Plan progress and achievements.
- Attend Community Wildfire Preparedness Workshop/ Firewise Workshop provided by Tahoe RCD and local fire districts.
- Attend local fire department meetings and agency meetings to remain informed on wildfire plans and disseminate information.
- Attend trainings by University of Reno LWF, Tahoe RCD and Fire Districts to learn to provide wildfire preparedness presentations.

# **Year Three**

- Update Firewise community members on Action Plan progress and achievements.
- Conduct home hazard assessments.
- Develop annual Firewise community newsletter.
- Develop Firewise community online survey questionnaire to capture data on local interests and concerns to then gather and prepare focused additional educational materials.
- Initiate 'Street Ambassador' educational program to increase capacity and conduct training sessions with partner groups including Tahoe RCD and local fire districts.
- Provide families with copies of the Children's Activity Book which includes: home hardening, defensible space and evacuation focus areas.

# **Home Hardening**

#### **Year One**

- Distribute home hardening literature provided by the Tahoe RCD and the University of Reno.
- Provide updates on Defensible Space ordinances.
- Provide information regarding fire insurance rebates for home hardening efforts to property owners.

#### **Year Two**

- Work on fuel treatment management efforts to reduce vegetative material in association with local fire districts and land management agencies.
- Organize a community event i.e. barbecue, July 4<sup>th</sup>, Halloween to initiate additional contact and education time and consider inviting local agencies fire and non-fire related.

# **Year Three**

- Work with neighborhoods and/or community organizations to promote/host a community workday to reduce fuel and maintain defensible space compliance.
- Work on 'model' show and tell homes and lots to encourage other neighborhoods to join Firewise.

Specifically tied to Risk Assessment examples- encourage neighbors to:

- Attach attic ventilation screens on homes where missing
- For homes with wood fences within 5 feet remove section and replace with nonflammable materials
- Replace wood shake roofs
- Place street numbers on houses and replace damaged street signs
- Replace foundation vents with 1/8 meshing
- Remove all lattice under decks

# **Defensible Space and Fuel Reduction**

# **Year One**

- Partner with UC Cooperative Extension and STPUD to host demonstrations of defensible space landscaping practices.
- Work with neighborhoods and/or community organizations to promote/host a community workday to reduce fuel and maintain compliance.
- Encourage neighbors to sign up for chipping services.

# **Year Two**

- Host a Firewise community home ignition zone assessment day and home hardening workshop.
- Provide information regarding urban lot stewardship program to property owners.
- Partner with South Tahoe Refuse! to host demonstrations of landscape refuse removal.

# **Year Three**

 Create work parties and work with local groups like CCC and High School Clubs to work to clear and maintain non private lots and/or assist elderly residents.

# **Evacuation Planning and Wildfire Preparedness**

# **Year One**

- Educate public about go-bags and other household level wildfire preparedness measures including Evacuation lists provided by Tahoe RCD.
- Sign-up for alerts event- have everyone sign up and understand the process.
- Identify and map those in need.
- Work with local fire districts on 'Adopt a Hydrant' programs in winter months.

#### Year Two

- Partner with local fire districts to organize and host a practice evacuation drill in one neighborhood.
- Distribute community evacuation maps.
- Update residents new homeowners utilizing Zillow and drop off educational Go Bags.

# **Year Three**

- Work with local fire districts to inform mapping of fire suppression resources and considerations with local neighborhood knowledge (e.g., water resources and access for structure triage).
- Partner with local fire districts to organize and host a practice evacuation drill in one neighborhood.
- Work with property owners/managers of vacation rentals to post area maps of evacuation routes for tourists.

# Support

Our assistance and resources are available for groups that have signed up with Tahoe RCD to become a Fire Adapted Community.

These are the agency groups that will assist you: Tahoe RCD, Local Fire District

This is the support that you will receive from Tahoe RCD, your local fire district, Living with Fire and UC Davis Master Gardeners will provide:

- 1. Workshops,
- 3. Banners and lanyards,
- 4. Educational webinars,
- 5. Multiple meeting opportunities with other Firewise neighborhoods
- 6. Educational materials including Go Bags for new residents and new FAC sites

Every third year (once every 3 years), Tahoe RCD can attend a community workday to assist with outreach and education to your community. It may be possible to attend more often if resources are available.
