Top Ten Points for Neighborhood Leaders

- Don't overthink things! The process is simple: connect and work together to reduce wildfire risk.
- 2 Don't do it alone. With larger areas, designate 1-2 streets to an Ambassador. Remember, you share a vision!
- Connect with your neighborhood. Get a small group together and start talking.
- Set a timeframe for yourself. Waiting too long can stall the process so ride that momentum from the start.
- 5 Knowledge comes with time. Educate yourself and others as you go.
- Use our support systems like the Tahoe RCD and your local fire district! Check out our website, publications, and supporting documents.
- 7 Don't expect 100% compliance. Start with 20% and a core group of dedicated and supportive neighbors and build from there.
- The first year is the most time-consuming but it gets easier. Lean on existing groups to guide you; they've already done the work!
- The focus is being prepared and safe above all else. This must be the core value of the group.
